As part of the mentoring programme, the participants exchange ideas about their career plans as humanists and social scientists with their own mentors from non-university organizations ("mentoring tandem"), among the participants ("peer mentoring"), and as part of an accompanying programme organized by the BGHS. Requirements: Mentees take part in the mentoring tandem, the peer mentoring and the accompanying programme for BGHS mentoring.

Our offer: The programme runs from January 2022 to September 2022. The mentee and mentor hold a monthly discussion on career planning over a period of six months. Mentees exchange questions and ideas about professional careers over a period of nine months. The mentoring is flanked by a series of workshops on non-university careers.
